Don't spend a lot of time reviewing resources that are not for your current project. **Use a clipper program** to collect them to be sorted later.

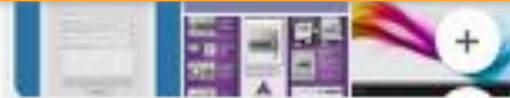
